StoryWalk – Karl Infanger and Kevin Collins

Mr., Infanger and Mr. Collins presented the Committee with a request for funding for this project. StoryWalk is a project that includes kiosk's that in order tell a story. This story can be about anything, flowers, the history of Medway, an actual book; the story behind the high school. There will be 12 kiosks in total, along the 1.5 mile path that runs between the high school and Choate Park. Their plan is to have different classes supply the story and each story would run approximately one month. Mr. Infanger has a Master Gardener who has volunteered to help with the landscaping of each kiosk.

This project is curriculum based and involves both literacy and exercise for all the students involved and the community that walks the trail.

The cost of each kiosk is based upon the material used and who does the building. If it is done by volunteers the costs would be approximately \$200 each; if build commercially, the costs would run \$800-\$1000 each.

After a discussion it was determined that this project would qualify under the recreation aspect of the Community Preservation Act and that although this Committee likes this idea, they need more information. Mr. Infanger and Mr. Collins were asked to come back to the October 5, 2015 meeting with more definite figures, time frames, installation information, opinions from other boards in town that should be informed of this project (ConCom, Town Administrator, BOS. School Committee). They we also instructed due to time constraints that they need to get a place holder for the November STM.

Conway School – Jennifer

Ms._____ was present to present an update on this project.

The Conway School is very interested in working with Medway; all the required paperwork has been prepared and is ready for submittal to the Conway School for a decision. This School choses projects to be worked on by their Master's Candidates; spring 2016 is the anticipated start date.

This project will focus on a 47.8 acre parcel of land with the possibility of an additional 9 acres being looked at.

After a discussion which included doing the work in phases in order to include the whole corridor and other long term concerns; it was noted that the Committee is generally in favor of this Open Space sponsored project.

Open Space is looking to extend the current trail that is at the High School. They would like to extend it to Idylbrook Farm. They are the beginning of the process and will update as needed.

#6: Repurpose CPA Funds: Athletic Fields Project to High School Baseball Field Improvements and the addition of a storage unit. \$195,000

Town Manager Michael Boynton DPS Director Tom Holder

Funds are the balances left in past TM Articles:

\$34,717.17 - Engineer and Design

\$160,787.07 - Construction

The purpose of this Article is to make safety improvements to the current baseball diamond.

Currently there is no safe warm up area for pitchers and the backstop is too low.

Mr. Boynton and Mr. Holder explained that in its current shape, a pitcher warming up is in the line of foul balls that are hit and the backstop is too low as currently foul balls are going over and into the woods. Funds would be used to re-engineer field and replace backstop with a taller one. Costs: \$150,000. The funds would also be used to purchase a storage unit with several garage doors to hold baseball equipment and track and field equipment; as well as field maintenance equipment. Costs: \$40,000.

Motion:

A motion was made and seconded to recommend that the Town repurpose the sum of \$195,000 from Article 8 of the November 18, 2013 Fall Town Meeting and Article 13 of the May 12 2014 Annual Meeting for the purpose of creating safer conditions on the high school baseball field and the addition of a storage unit. The recommendation comes with the condition that there be a mechanism in place that ensures that non-school groups have access to this field.

Land Acquisition: 54R Adams Street \$85,000.00

Land price: \$75,000 Legal Fees: \$10,000

The purpose of this Article is to purchase the land listed as 54R Adams Street; which consists of approximately 33 acres.

Article 9:

Trail Design and Engineering Jim Wieler Dave Kaeli \$35,000

The purpose of this Article is to design and engineer a trail system from Medway High School to Lovering Street. It is an extension of the trail system that is currently in place. The Trails Committee hopes to go to bid in March, 2015. Plan is to include bridges and trails that fit into the natural landscape of the land. Motion:

A motion was made and unanimously passed to recommend that the Town approve the use of \$35,000 to design and engineer a trail system from the High School to Lovering Street. Funds from the Open Space Reserves will be used to fund this Article.

Article 10:

Storywalk Karl Infanger Kevin Collins High School Teachers \$10,000

The purpose of this Article is to fund the building of storyboards that will be placed along the trail that runs behind the high school to Choate Park. The idea is that the twelve (12) stations will tell a story as you walk along the trail. These stories, can be of any nature and will be hosted by different groups and grades on a monthly basis. These stations will be made to resist tampering, the weather and use. This Committee also asked that other town groups be allowed the opportunity to fill these stations, and that this recommendation is contingent upon there being a memorandum of understanding in place for this.

Motion:

A motion was made and unanimously passed to recommend that the Town approve the use of funds from the CPA General fund to purchase and install twelve (12) story stations along the trail that runs from behind the High School to Choate Park. This recommendation comes with the condition that these stations are not exclusive to the schools, that other town groups has an opportunity to fill them.

Article 11:

Master Plan Update: Parks, Open space and Athletic Fields \$19,000 Glen Trindade Board of Selectman Member, Tom Holder, DPS Director

The purpose of this Article is to fund the updating of the field study which was last prepared in 2012. Updating of this plan is necessary in order for the town to apply for a one million dollar (\$1,000,000) grant that would be used to update these areas in town. Plan needs to be completed by January 1, 2016. The field study will be conducted by Gale Associates.

Mr. Trindade explained that although the current field study is relatively new, in order to apply for this grant it needs to be more specific. The new plan would also include an entire best use concept of all town playgrounds and fields; concentrating on Choate Park; making it the show piece the Town wants it to be. It was also mentioned that with the upcoming Route 109 construction the entrance of Choate Park will be changing, thereby causing other issues within the park. The Town is looking to have an overall idea of the best uses of the areas, rather than using funds Band-Aid problems.

Costs are undeterminable at this time, but in order to receive the one million dollar (\$1,000,000) grant from the State, the Town must commit to a spending budget of two million dollars (\$2,000,000). During this discussion concerns were raised about the need for the study, the costs of the study as well as the company that will be performing the study. Concerns included past experiences with this company and its inability to look outside the box with ideas, as well as the being bigger than a \$19,000 problem. Committee members also expressed concerns about this companies' ability to produce a plan that will allow the town to build upon the original concept.

After a lengthy discussion surrounding the need for this document as well as the company that has been chosen to do the study a motion was made:

Discussion:

Concerns were raised as to the need to provide guidance to the company chosen in the form of: maps, layouts, how to prepare for the grant application and pricing for plans moving forward. It was also stated that this company/Town should include the Friends of Choate and other town groups in all discussions for this concept. It was agreed by all that town Administrator Michael Boynton will take responsibility to ensure that this happens.

Motion:

A motion was made and passed to recommend that the town approve the use of \$19,000 of Community Preservation Act Funds from the Open Space Reserves to fund a consulting, design and engineering services to update the town of Medway Parks' Open Space and Athletic Fields Master Plan; including improvements to Choate Park, and enhanced access to open space. The product the Town receives must be a building block for the future uses with or with the State Grant money.
