2 Approval of Minutes:

3 Presentation: Columbia Gas

Liz Cellucci with Columbia Gas of Mass out of Westboro gave a powerpoint presentation on their Energy Efficiency Outreach efforts. ("Columbia Gas Presentation

1-20-2016"https://drive.google.com/file/d/0B24GUeBzJ19McVRWRkw5eWFYb2hiUVFzX0EwTmE5Yi14 MG5j/view?usp=sharing) They collaborate closely with Eversource and DOER to provide consistent efficiency-enhancing resources among communities: assessments, rebates, incentives, and installations. John asked about incentives to convert from electric to gas heating systems for multi-unit housing. Liz pointed us to MassSave or Eversource.

Committee asked about incentives to get the gas company to lay pipes in new developments. This would be a By-Law issue.

Many ideas for outreach to various groups were raised: COA for assessments and fuel assistance, PEDB for By-Law recommendations, Building Inspector for above-code construction and renovation incentives,

Medway Business Council for commercial/industrial EE incentives. Columbia Gas recently gave Medway a grant for \$8,400 for the Middle School; Eversource gave \$14,400, both of which will be earmarked to an energy efficiency fund.

Columbia Gas is eager to assist with our MassSave outreach: program sponsorship; teacher training grants; team to video-record an assessment and resulting installations in town.

4 Update from Medway Energy Manager:

The annual Green Communities Report for 2015 was submitted to the DOER on time. Shelley moved to approve the report, Larry seconded. No discussion. Unanimous approval. Bob is to back out increased usage from municipal facilities that came online after 2009 to better evaluate if we achieved the 20% reduction in consumption.

Maine Energy Systems wants to present the benefits of their pellet stoves to the committee. The committee declined, as there has not been demand for this type of heat, and we do not want to sponsor individual businesses.

Bob to get the High School solar monitor functioning again.

5 Report from the Chair:

It's time to write the annual report for the committee. Carey will start a Google Doc and asks that all review and contribute.

Carey plans to attend the school's STEM event in March.

6 Reports from Members:

John Foresto wants to introduce the new town communications director, who can coordinate our Facebook page efforts, and plans to coordinate a monthly town newsletter - to which we need to plan to contribute.

7 Ongoing Issues:

Community Aggregation (CA): The MAPC has chosen Good Energy (GEC) to broker community aggregation deals for its communities. GEC made a deal for the SERPA towns at 9.4c (Eversource is currently at 10.8c). Each town would make its own contract through GEC. Options include renewable % and rate. Lively debate about the merits of CA, cost, education, outreach, renewable content, town meeting approval, etc ensued.

Bob brought a sample warrant article. The process would be to have the MEC approve the concept, then FinCom approve the article, the Bd of Selectmen approve the article, then it is presented for the town meeting warrant. Larry suggested that we begin that process with a non-binding ballot question to determine if the community is open to the concept.

The committee agreed to invite GEC to our February meeting to present their programs, and record it live on local cable, including discussion and debate on the benefits for Medway among the committee members.
