Nearly two years ahead of schedule, Medway has paid off its deficit financing and is no longer under DOR oversight nor required to have DOR approval for borrowings.



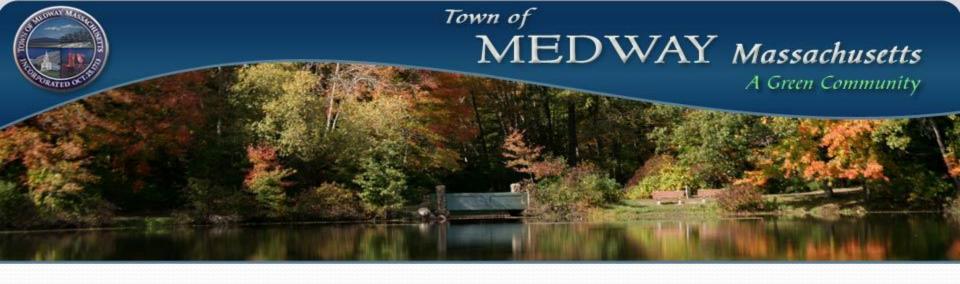

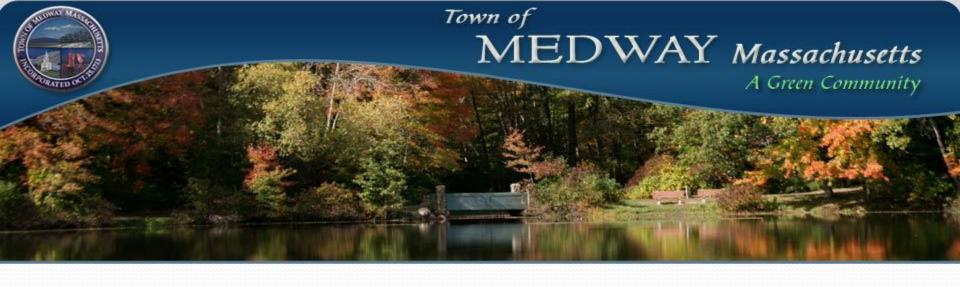

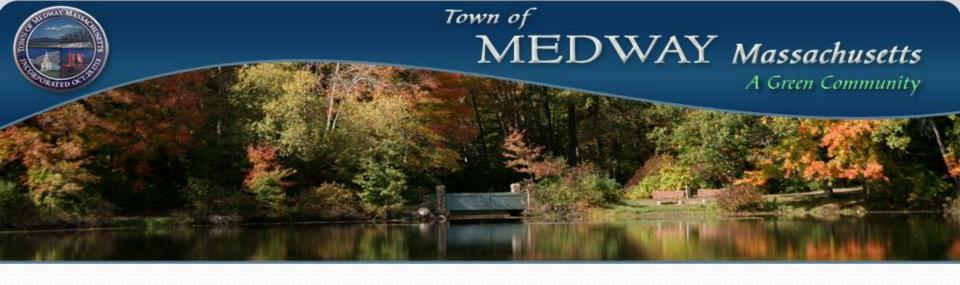

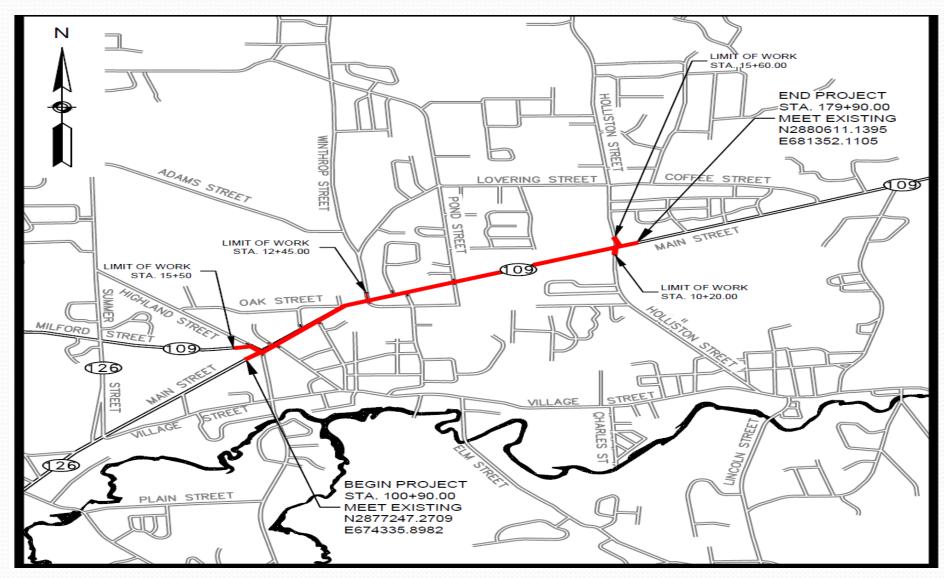

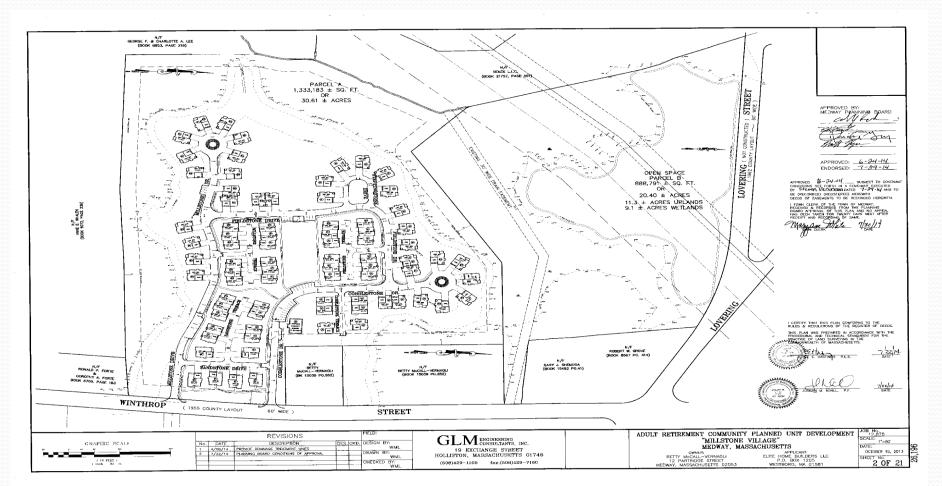
MILLSTONE PROJECT-UNDER CONSTRUCTION
