Cost savings of approximately \$2.4M since 2006 if rating had stayed at BBB.

OPEB Position

- \$300,000 additional was appropriated by Town Meeting.
- OPEB funds moved to Rockland Trust in Dec. 2018.
- Current balance is \$1.28M with an 11% return last year.
- OPEB liabilities were reduced by \$6.6M.
- Stabilization funds remain in CDs.

A LOOK BACK

- Implemented enhanced Communications Plan.
- Implemented tuition-free full-day Kindergarten.
- Weatherized Town Hall, Fire Station, and Senior Center with Green Communities Grant of \$95K.
- Completed park improvements projects with McGovern and Memorial playgrounds.
- Continued road and sidewalk repair plan (Year 2) 21 Streets, 6 Sidewalks.
- Broke Ground on DPW Facility.
- Began engineering for Water Treatment Facility.
- Refurbished basketball court and established walking trail to Senior Center at Oakland Park.
- Initiated transition to Wireless Fire Call Boxes.
- Completed Route 109 Project.

MAJOR CAPITAL NEEDS

- DPS Facility (\$13.5M Est.)
- Roads and sidewalks (Year 3 of Repair Plan)(\$2M per year)
- Centralized Water Treatment and Capacity Upgrades (\$16.8M of which town meeting already approved \$3.6M)
- Impact from results of public facilities, structural and space analysis
 - School building roof repairs (McGovern and Memorial) (\$2.1M)
