- A. <u>22-24 Evergreen Street</u>. Attorney Paul Kenney wishes to speak to this Commission. The 9-month delay imposed by the HC expired in 2018 and the HC expected no further involvement. The Building Commissioner would like the Commission to vote under Article XVII, Section 3.8, whether the Commission is satisfied that the owners have made bona fide and reasonable efforts to locate a purchaser to preserve, rehabilitate and restore the building, but such efforts were unsuccessful.
- B. <u>42 Highland Street</u>. The HC considered this property in 2016 and declared it not historically significant. Now a new owner has applied to demolish and the HC needs to look at it again again since the original owner took no action within one year of the decision.
